



2026 Agricultural Injury Prevention Youth Grant

Created in 1990, Iowa's Center for Agricultural Safety and Health (I-CASH) is funded by the Iowa Legislature. The mission of I-CASH is to lead statewide partnerships that promote agricultural safety and health. Each year I-CASH designates funds for community grants to youth aimed at the prevention of farm-related injury.

- \$800 grants are available to decrease the risk of illness or injury due to farm hazard exposure. Additional funding for 2026 projects is provided by the CHS Foundation.
- Applications will be reviewed by members of the I-CASH advisory board. Criteria for selection will be based on youth leadership, use of funds, collaboration, and proposed activities.
- All projects must be run through an educational, agricultural, youth or similar organization. Grants funds will not be paid directly to individuals.
- One project will be selected for the *Outstanding Youth Grant Award* which will be presented at the 2026 Midwest Regional Agricultural Safety and Health (MRASH) meeting usually held in mid-November. A cash award plus funding for travel and expenses to attend the meeting will be provided.

DEADLINES: Applications are due **April 17th, 2026**; funding announcements will be made by **April 24th, 2026**. A final report is due **October 9th, 2026**. Contact Kim McMichael, at 319-467-4320 or kimberlee-mcmichael@uiowa.edu with questions or for more information.

Project Description

Farming is a dangerous occupation, and Iowa has lots of farms. This grant program was developed to encourage youth to take an active role in preventing injuries and deaths on farms by raising awareness about safety and health issues with farmers and other youth in their community. The projects should be **planned and conducted by youth**, with adults serving as mentors and advisors.

Rural hazards come in many forms and there are many topics that can be addressed. To select a topic, start by considering the type of farming in your community, any injuries or deaths that may have happened in the past, as well as the obvious hazards such as tractors and livestock. Don't forget about health issues such as hearing loss, sun exposure, ergonomics, and proper hydration.

The message of farm safety and health can be delivered in a variety of ways. **We encourage creative projects!** Here are some examples you may consider:

- Distribute SMV (slow moving vehicle) signs at the local implement dealership, using the opportunity to talk with farmers about roadway safety
- Make a poster about hearing protection for the county fair and hand out ear plugs and brochures
- Speak with farmers while they wait in line to drop off grain at the local co-op – pass out a fact sheet about respiratory health and give them dust masks
- Produce a YouTube video about safely sorting cattle, using the funds to purchase props for demonstrations, special makeup, or editing software
- Hold a local essay or poster contest about ATV safety and give ATV helmets away to the winners
